

Adult immunization schedule

Guidelines schedule from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Use this schedule to start a conversation with your doctor about which ones you should consider.

Flu shot	1 dose, annually				
Tetanus, diphtheria (TD) or Tetanus, diphtheria and whooping cough (Tdap)	Substitute Tdap for TD once, then TD booster every 10 years				
Measles, mumps, rubella (MMR)*	1 or 2 doses, depending on indication				
Chickenpox (VAR)*	2 doses, if you've never had the disease or vaccine				
Shingles (HZV)*				1 dose	
Human papilloma virus (HPV)-Female	3 doses				
Human papilloma virus (HPV)-Male*	3 doses	3 doses			
Pneumococcal conjugate vaccine (PCV13)*	1 dose				1 dose
Pneumococcal polysaccharide vaccine (PPSV23)*	1 or 2 doses, depending on indication				1 dose
Hepatitis A (HepA)*	2 or 3 doses, depending on vaccine				
Hepatitis B (HepB)*	3 doses				
MnACWY or MPSV4*	1 or more doses, depending on indication				
MenB*	2 or 3 doses, depending on vaccine				
Hib*	1 or 3 doses, depending on indication				

* For adults with certain medical conditions

Recommended for adults who meet the age requirement and have not received the vaccine or been infected with the disease

Recommended for adults with additional medical conditions or other indications
